Reading -- from "Why Bad Things Happen to Good People" -- Rabbi Harold Kushner

- Reader 1: Are you capable of forgiving and accepting love in a world which has disappointed you by not being perfect, a world in which there is so much unfairness and cruelty, disease and crime, earthquake and accident? Can you forgive its imperfections and love it because it is capable of containing great beauty and goodness, and because it is the only world we have?
- **Reader 2:** Are you capable of forgiving and loving the people around you, even if they have hurt you and let you down by not being perfect? Can you forgive them and love them, because there aren't any perfect people around, and because the penalty for not being able to love imperfect people is condemning oneself to loneliness?
- Reader 3: Are you capable of forgiving and loving God even when you have found out that God is not perfect, even when God has let you down and disappointed you by permitting bad luck and sickness and cruelty in the world and permitting some of those things to happen to you? Can you learn to love and forgive God despite God's limitations, and as you once learned to forgive and love your parents even though they were not as wise, strong, or as perfect as you needed them to be?
- Reader 4: And if you can do these things, will you be able to recognize that the ability to forgive and the ability to love are the weapons God has given us to enable us to live fully, bravely and meaningfully in this less-than-perfect world?
